DISABLED PERSON'S PARKING SCHEME

Conditions of Use of a Disabled Person's Parking Permit

- A permit is not valid:
 - After its expiry date – or
 - If the expiry date is not legible – or
 - If the permit number is not legible
- The parking entitlement applicable to the permit is valid anywhere in Victoria and interstate.
- The permit must be clearly displayed at the left side of the front windscreen with the expiry date and permit number clearly visible from outside the vehicle.
- A driver using the permit must be the permit holder or must be parking the vehicle for the convenience of the permit holder who needs to enter or leave the vehicle.
- The permit remains the property of the issuing Council and must be returned within 5 working days of notification of such return being required.
- A person may only hold one permit.
- A replacement permit will be issued in exchange for a faded or illegible one.

When requested by an authorised Officer, a driver using the permit must:

- State his/her name and address
- Produce his/her driver's licence
- Produce the relevant, valid, disabled person's permit
- Show proof that he/she, or a passenger in the vehicle, is the permit holder
- Move the vehicle from the reserved place, if the Officer deems that the permit is invalid or that there is insufficient proof that the driver or passenger in the vehicle is a permit holder.

Provided no other restrictions are broken, a vehicle correctly displaying a valid disabled person's parking permit may be parked as follows:

BLUE PERMITS

**In a parking area or bay marked for use by people, with disabilities, for the time specified for that area or bay, and, if applicable, on payment of any fee,
or**

For twice the specified time for any parking area or bay not designated for use by some class of persons or classes of vehicles. If applicable, any initial parking fee must be paid.

GREEN PERMITS

May park for twice the specified time for any parking area or bay not designated for use by classes of persons or classes of vehicles. If applicable, any initial parking fee must be paid. This Permit does not entitle the permit holder to park in **Blue disabled bays.**

An organisation may hold more than one permit, but must justify in writing to the Council the number of permits required or any increase in the number of permits required. An organisation may hold a trip specific permit.
