Positive Ageing Reference Group

Purpose

The purpose of PARG is to inform and advise Council on issues, barriers and aspirations of our older adult community. PARG is an inclusive group of older people, committed to ensuring Monash is an age friendly city and advocating on the issues and aspirations of our older residents. It is often invited by other departments to provide feedback and guidance to support Council to have an 'Age Friendly' lens across all policy development. PARG members are interviewed for selection and can remain on the committee for three terms (six years). Over the years there have been some founding member

PARG is currently represented by 10 community members and two Councillors. The term for the community membership is two years. Community members are appointed by Council following a public expression of interest.

Throughout the last two years of lockdown, two members have resigned (Dorothy Boysouth and Jan Goodwin) and due to COVID have not yet been replaced.

In December 2021 there are five potential new members being interviewed to recruit a full membership of 15 community representatives, and subsequently presently to Council for consideration.

Key initiatives

In this current term of the committee, these are the following projects that the committee has been involved in:

Increasing Places to Rest - development of a process to map existing and additional seating across all the 32 Monash Zones. Undertook a mapping exercise that has been merged into a central spreadsheet and mapped into GIS. A submission is being put forward in Our People Place for additional funding to install new seating and undertake additional maintenance to seating as identified by the mapping process. If the submission is successful, the work will be carried out in 2022 – 2023.

Loneliness Framework – feedback provided to Community Strengthening on the impact of Ageing and Loneliness.

Feedback and Advice on Social inclusion programs - Provide feedback on the key activities and make suggestions to support council staff in the delivery of the Positive Ageing Lifestyle (PALS) program and the Monash Seniors Festival program.

Zoom Meetings – During COVID lockdown members were supported by Council staff to attend Zoom meetings, increasing confidence plus awareness and knowledge of 'tec savvy' skills.

Positive Ageing Directory – Review and provide feedback on the newly developed Positive Ageing Directory to be launched in early 2022 as a resource for older residents to connect with their community.

Monash University Initiative - Monash Council has partnered with Monash University in their bid for an Industrial Transformation Training Centre in Optimal Ageing. The bid was successful and members of PARG will be invited to be on the Monash University Optimising Ageing Centre focus group.

Other Business

Monash Youth Committee

Purpose

The Monash Youth Committee (MYC) is an inclusive group of young people, committed to creating greater connections between young people and Monash Council. MYC discuss and take action on issues affecting young people living in the City of Monash.

The Committee has two broad objectives:

- a) To function as a consultation panel of young people that provides input into the development of Council policy and planning frameworks.
- b) To act as a conduit for the positive promotion of young people's ideas and achievements.

Achievements for 2021

The MYC continued to meet monthly during 2021, all meeting excluding one were via video conferencing platforms. This provided both an opportunity for Council and other organisations to consult with the committee on various topics as well as an opportunity for the members to develop their skills and have a voice about the issues important to the young people in Monash.

In 2021, the MYC has undertaken the following:

MYC sent a letter to local Federal Members of Parliament in late 2020 raising its concerns in regard to changes made to the Higher Education Support Amendment (Job-Ready Graduates and Supporting Regional and Remote

Students). In early 2021 members met with Clare O'Neil, Federal Member for Hotham to discuss their concerns.

In collaboration with Monash Council's sustainability team MYC Facilitated a youth Sustainability workshop online for Monash young people as a part of Clayton Festival.

Provided written feedback to Council in regard to the draft Monash Municipal Public Health & Wellbeing plan 2021 – 2025. A couple of the issues MYC raised were in regard to addressing healthy eating and potential addictions, promoting the use of green spaces to those who typically do not utilise them and having improved measurable outcomes for council climate change goals.

MYC Undertook training further developing their skills in advocacy through The Workshop Melbourne.

In the September school holidays MYC organised Mandy Money to deliver an online Financial Management workshop for young people aged 15-25 years. Topics covered included university loans, spending traps, budgeting, tax, investing and superannuation. The workshop was very popular with 124 young people attending the ninety-minute session. Monash Youth Committee has identified that there should be greater emphasis placed on financial management in secondary school curriculum and will be raising this issue with State Members of Parliament.

The MYC wrote to both State and Federal Members of Parliament requesting a meeting with them to discuss issues affecting young people in the City of Monash and to understand what each government are doing to help young people within the City of Monash. Issues of importance relating to Federal Government are: Treasury Laws Amendment (Your Future, Your Super) Bill 2021, Impacts of recent amendment to the Higher Education Support Amendment (Job-Ready Graduates and Supporting Regional and Remote Students) Bill 2020, Fair Work Amendment (Supporting Australia's Jobs and Economic Recovery) Bill 2021 and Wage increases for young people under the age of 21 years to ensure young people are not living below the poverty line. Issues of importance relating to State Government are: Victorian Governments electric vehicle policy, Secure Work Pilot Scheme, Housing Affordability and Secondary School Curriculum embedding financial literacy. MYC committee have currently met with Bruce Atkinson MP, Steve Dimopoulos MP, Meng Heang Tak MP, Matt Fregon MP and Will Fowles MP.

Members for endorsement or reappointment

MYC received three resignations, predominately related to committee members increasing work, school or university commitments. These members have been active and valuable representatives of young people through their involvement in and contribution to MYC: Mr Raghav Baheti, Ms Shreeya Kalagotla and Mr Jonathan Lee.

To fill vacancies, the MYC continually seeks membership from young people aged 15-25 who live, go to school, or work in the City of Monash. Mr Justin Leung and Ms Joyce Hu were successful in their application for MYC subject to Council's endorsement.

As a result of the resignations and appointments in this report the group will have 20 endorsed members of young people. Currently, there is one place available for new MYC members in 2021. We expect more resignations from MYC at the end of the year.
