INTRODUCTION

It should be noted that some scheduled meetings were cancelled during 2022 due the impacts of COVID-19, although many were able to be held virtually.

The contribution of time, experience and expertise by many community members through their membership of these Committees and forums is valuable in ensuring that Council hears directly from its most important stakeholders in relation to a range of social and community issues. A key contribution made by many members during 2022 was the participation in and feedback on a number of draft Strategies and Plans.

During 2023 a review of the appointment of representatives from agencies and organisations will be undertaken at a Policy level to ensure that it is clear that it is the organisation that has membership of the Advisory Committee rather than the individual nominated by the organisation.

Purpose

Junior Advisory Group (JAG)

Purpose

The Junior Advisory Group:

- Connects young people with their Local Government/Councillors.
- Enables Monash students in Grades 4 to 6 to raise concerns or questions.
- Provides a forum for children as active citizens.

Composition

Students from Monash primary schools and two Councillors attend each session. The Junior Advisory Group typically meets twice per year, around April/May and during Children's Week in October.

Frequency of meetings

One Junior Advisory Group meeting occurred in 2022.

Junior Advisory Group sessions will resume in early 2023.

Achievements for 2022

In 2022, the MYC undertook the following:

- MYC has discussed the following issues:
 - o housing affordability
 - increase costs associated with tertiary education
 - working towards zero emissions with vehicles
 - embedding respectful relationships and financial literacy in secondary school curriculum
- The Monash Youth Committee met with Hon Sonja Terpstra MP, Hon Dr Tien Kieu, and Hon Gordon Rich Phillips to discuss issues impacting Monash young people. These meetings ensure that Monash young people's views are considered by members of State and Federal governments.

Monash Youth Committee members found meeting with Members of Parliament to be rewarding.

Several Members of Parliament have agreed to share the committees' concerns, within their parties.

 In July 2022 Monash Youth Committee organised a networking event for youth committees in the City of Monash. The goal of the event was to improve relationships between youth committees and create future opportunities for collaboration. • 18 young people attended the events from Rotaract, Youth Ambassadors, Quiksound and Monash Youth Committee. Each group had the opportunity to share information about their group purpose and discussed current projects and priorities.

Members for endorsement or reappointment

During 2022 MYC received eight resignations. These resignations predominately related to committee members increasing work, school, or university commitments. These members have been active and valuable representatives through their involvement in and contribution to MYC in 2022: Mr Jacob Biviano, Ms Jazzy Howlett, Ms Stacey Rindel, Mr Justin Leung, Ms Misha Kasinathan, Ms Evonne Lu, Mr Siddhant Tandon and Ms Maria Saribalas.

To fill vacancies, the MYC continually seeks membership from young people aged 15 – 25 who live, go to school, or work in the City of Monash. In 2022 Ms Bella Young, Ms Eva Mohan, Ms Khai Chan, Ms Lavanya Sharma, Mr Kabisan Sutharsan, Mr Ari Stidistsoulakos, Ms Serene Karunaratne and Mr Heerag Khan were successful in their application for MYC subject to Council's endorsement.

As a result of the resignations and appointments in this report the group will have 20 endorsed members of young people. Currently, there is one place available for a new MYC member in 2023.

More resignations from MYC are expected at the end of the year.

Glen Waverley Activity Centre Committee

Purpose

The purpose of the Glen Waverley Activity Centre Committee is to provide high level advice, direction and input into major Council and State Government projects and strategic policy initiatives for the Glen Waverley Activity Centre (**GWAC**).

The key areas of focus for the preceding 12 months include:

- Community meeting spaces for Glen Waverley.
- The establishment of a town square in Kingsway.
- Future options for the Central Car Park site.
- Replacement car parking.
- In addition to the areas of focus identified above, the Committee may also take on other areas of focus relating to the GWAC.
- The Montclair Multideck Car Park project.

- Implications for Council and the GWAC arising from the State Government's Suburban Rail Loop project.
- The redevelopment and reinvigoration of Kingsway (with an increased focus on pedestrians and outdoor dining).
- A new library

These areas will continue to be the focus for the Committee for the next 12 months.

Objectives

The objectives of the GWAC Committee are:

- Provide input and advice to Council on opportunities, Council and State Government driven strategic development issues and major projects in the Activity Centre.
- Actively support and assist Council's consultation with, engagement and advocacy to the State Government, relevant stakeholders and the broader community in relation to the GWAC.
- Assist with shaping and encouraging a reinvigorated Kingsway streetscape which prioritises pedestrians, outdoor dining and other activity over cars.
- Recommend to Council appropriate projects or development opportunities for the GWAC.
- Assist Council in determining priorities and strategic directions for the Activity Centre.

Committee Composition

The Committee comprises of the Mayor and the Glen Waverley ward Councillors.

One of the Committee members will be appointed to chair the Committee. This appointment will be made by either the Council or the Mayor. It will be supported by the Chief Executive Officer, Director of City Development, Director of Community Services and other officers as required.

Frequency of Meeting

The Committee meets on a monthly basis or as needed.
