7.3.5 S18 INSTRUMENT OF SUB-DELEGATION UNDER THE ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION ACT 2017

RECOMMENDATION

In the exercise of the power conferred by s 437(2) of the *Environment Protection Act 2017* and the Instrument of Delegation of the Environment Protection Authority under the Act dated 4 June 2021, Monash City Council (Council) resolves that:

- There be delegated to the members of Council staff holding, acting in or performing the
 duties of the offices or positions referred to in the attached Instrument of Delegation to
 members of Council staff, the powers, duties and functions set out in that instrument,
 subject to the conditions and limitations specified in that Instrument.
- 2. The instrument comes into force immediately after the common seal of Council is affixed to the instrument.
- 3. The duties and functions set out in the instrument must be performed, and the powers set out in the instruments must be executed, in accordance with any guidelines or policies of Council that it may from time to time adopt.

INTRODUCTION

This report recommends that the Council gives certain powers to enforcement officers who handle noise from residential construction and Environmental Health Officers who manage septic systems. The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) allows councils to appoint these officers under the Environment Protection Act 2017. These officers can then be given specific EPA powers.

To enable Council officers to perform their duties in line with updated legislation and EPA delegation, it is necessary to have both an Instrument of Appointment and Authorisation issued by the Chief Executive Officer and an Instrument of Sub-Delegation from council to Council officers in place. Council officers previously (and until recently) would enforce these provisions under its Local Law and the powers therein.

The Instrument of Sub-Delegation under the Act (Attachment 1) is new to Monash and requires Council's approval.

COUNCIL PLAN STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

Good Governance

Maintain the highest standards of good governance.

BACKGROUND

The Environment Protection Act 2017 helps the EPA and other authorities reduce pollution and waste. Supported by the Environment Protection Regulations 2021, councils can manage and enforce:

- Residential noise
- Noise from construction, demolition, and removal of homes
- On-site wastewater systems (septic systems)

Councils and litter authorities can also control illegal littering and waste disposal.

Due to changes in the Act, the EPA gave certain powers to councils on June 4, 2021 (see Attachment 2). While the Council's regulatory powers haven't changed much, it's necessary to delegate these functions to Council staff.

Previously, noise from residential construction was regulated under Local Law No.3 – Community Amenity. This has been replaced by the Community Safety and Amenity Local Law 2024. The new local law doesn't cover residential noise because it's already addressed by the Environment Protection Act 2017, and the local law has been amended and refined so as to not duplicate or provide for powers that are provided for in other legislation.

The Act regulates noise differently for residential construction and general residential noise. The Chief Executive Officer can authorise employees as Residential Noise Enforcement Officers (RNEOs) to handle noise from things like stereos, TVs, air conditioners, lawn mowers, and power tools. Noise from construction and demolition is regulated by powers delegated from the EPA to the Council, and then to officers.

DISCUSSION

Sub-Delegation of Powers

The EPA has delegated enforcement powers to the Council, which should then delegate these to Council officers. Under the Instrument of Sub-Delegation, Council's authorised officers have various powers, including:

- Issuing and amending improvement notices to address situations likely to harm health or the environment (section 271).
- Issuing and amending prohibition notices to stop activities likely to cause harm (section 272).
- Powers of entry and inspection.
- Issuing infringement notices for breaches of the Act.

Previously, these powers were executed through the Local Law, which regulated the timing of noise from building works. Now, under the Environment Protection Act, residential construction noise is governed by the General Environmental Duty (GED). The GED requires proactive steps to minimize environmental harm.

Delegated officers can issue Improvement Notices to address non-compliance and Prohibition Notices to stop harmful activities. These can include non-compliance with the GED or unreasonable noise from residential construction. Failure to comply can lead to prosecution or an Infringement Notice.

Additionally, the EPA has delegated powers to the Council to enforce regulations for on-site wastewater management systems (septic systems under 5000 litres). While Monash currently has no such systems, it's necessary to delegate these powers in case an application is made.

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that the Council approve the Instrument of Sub-Delegation. Since the Local Law on noise from building works is no longer in effect, the Council should delegate powers to enforcement officers to handle noise complaints from residential construction. Additionally, Environmental Health Officers should be given powers to enforce regulations for septic systems.

This approval will allow Council officers to perform their duties according to the Act and EPA guidelines.

 - 5.1.2. noise from the construction, demolition or removal of residential premises;
- 6. the delegate must not determine the issue, take the action or do the act or thing:
 - 6.1. if the issue, action, act or thing is an issue, action or thing which Council has previously designated as an issue, action, act or thing which must be the subject of a Resolution of Council;
 - 6.2. if the determining of the issue, taking of the action or doing of the act or thing would or would be likely to involve a decision which is inconsistent with a
 - 6.2.1. policy; or
 - 6.2.2. strategy
 - 6.2.3. adopted by Council;
 - 6.3. if the determining of the issue, the taking of the action or the doing of the act or thing cannot be the subject of a lawful delegation; or
 - 6.4. the determining of the issue, the taking of the action or the doing of the act or thing is already the subject of an exclusive delegation to another member of Council staff.
