The four-year term of Monash's current councillors is coming to a close, with

Council elections to be held in Monash (and across Victoria) in October.


Previously, Monash was represented by 11 councillors across four wards: Glen Waverley, Mt Waverley, Mulgrave and Oakleigh – but, in February 2024, the Victorian Government introduced changes to the ward boundaries and Monash will now have 11 wards with a single councillor representing each ward: Gardiners Creek, Blackburn, Gallaghers, Mayfield, Scotchmans Creek, Jells, University, Warrigal, Banksia, Wellington and Waverley Park.

The Victorian Electoral Commission is conducting Monash's election, which will be held by postal vote, with people to complete their ballots and put them in the mail by 6pm on Friday 25 October 2024.

The current Council will go into caretaker mode from Tuesday 17 September, meaning the Council will avoid making significant policies or decisions that could unreasonably bind a future Council. During the caretaker period, Council will continue to decide upon statutory matters, such as planning permit applications, and carry out its normal everyday services.


## **RATES PAYMENT**

## it's swooping season again

If you've ever had the misfortune to be on the receiving end of the attentions of a dive-bombing magpie or noisy miner, you can probably vouch for it being a frightening experience.

Over the coming months, during breeding season, birds might be swooping to protect their nests and their young.

Not all birds will display this behaviour. Most magpies don't swoop, and of those that do, only a tiny minority make contact. Most of the time, they will make a harmless (though terrifying) near miss, accompanied by beak clicking.

#### Here's some tips to help you avoid swooping birds:

- Know the local swooping hotspots
- Avoid the area if you can
- Wear sunglasses and a wide-brimmed hat
- Move quickly and calmly, as running might provoke further attack
- If riding a bike, hop off and walk your bike through the area
- Do not harass birds as this will only provoke them. Magpies have been known to remember people and attack over successive seasons.

## FAS AWARDS Exhibition Roadshow!




The inaugural For Arts' Sake (FAS) Awards exhibition is underway at Waverley Gardens Shopping Centre.
