

Street Tree Renewal Information – Barlyn Road, Mount Waverley

The table below lists the details of the trees to be removed at each location. For replacement details, please refer to map below.

No	Location	Species	Condition Assessment
1.	1/25 Barlyn Road	<i>Prunus cerasifera Nigra</i>	Multiple wounds with decay, scaffold branch splitting and dieback in canopy, < 2 Years ULE.
2.	29 Barlyn Road	<i>Callistemon salignus</i>	Splitting, large wound in scaffold branch, < 2 Years ULE.
3.	59 Barlyn Road	<i>Buckinghamia celsissima</i>	Mechanical damage has contributed to death of the tree, < 2 Years ULE.
4.	42 Barlyn Road	<i>Leptospermum petersonii</i>	15mm split in trunk, < 2 Years ULE.
5.	22 Barlyn Road	<i>Agonis flexuosa</i>	In decline, < 2 Years ULE.

*< 2 Years ULE - with a useful life expectancy of less than two years

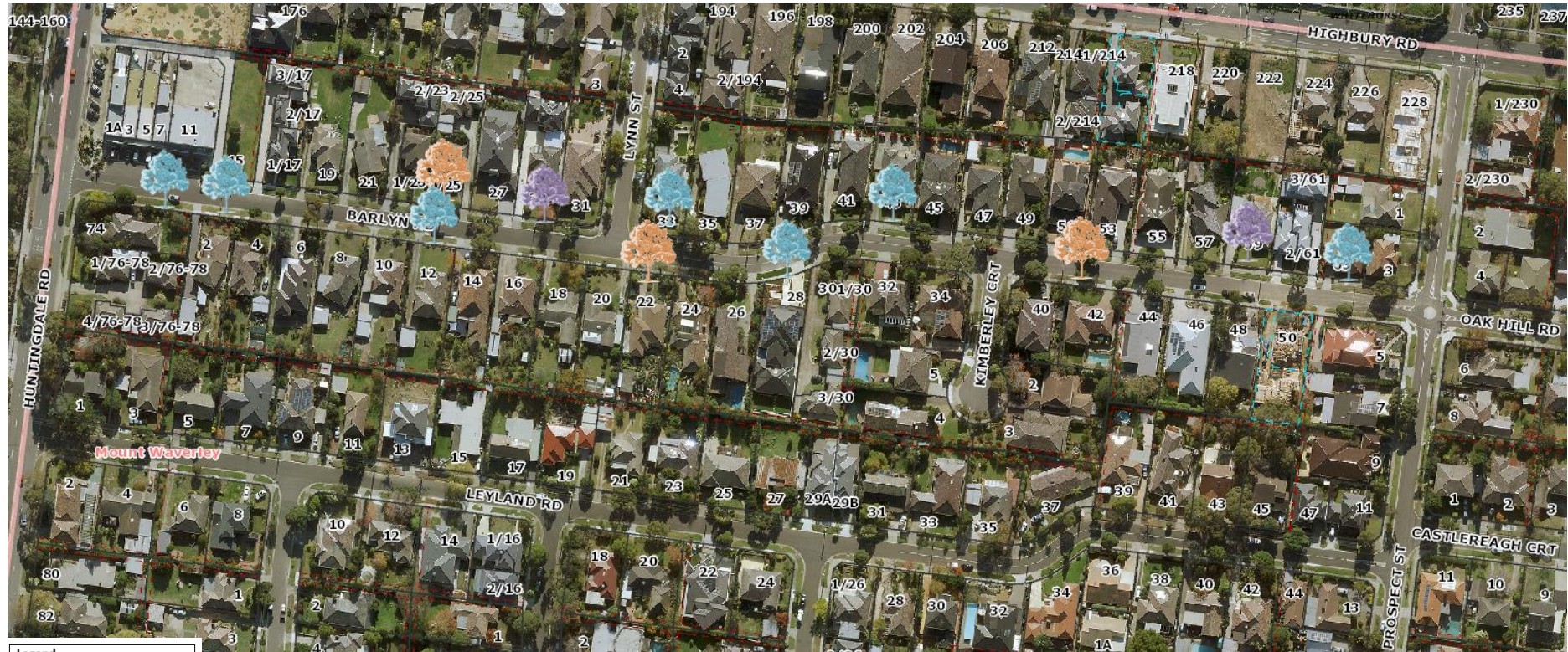

Proposed Tree Species Options

Option 1 – Single species (both sides of the road)

<i>Callistemon viminalis</i> (Weeping Bottle Brush)	
Power line and non-power line side	
	<p>This is a pretty, bird-attracting native tree with a heavy crown due to the profusion of brilliant red flowers in spring and summer. It is the weight of these flowers that gives it a pendulous habit.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 6-8 x 6-8m Form: Pendulous</p>

Option 2 – Single species (both sides of the road)

<i>Corymbia maculata</i> 'Little Mac' (Dwarf Spotted Gum)	
Non-power line side	
	<p>This tree grows straight and tall. The bark is smooth and cream in colour with grey spots from the older bark, providing contrast and interest with its mottled appearance. The leaves are dark green and glossy and from autumn to winter, small clusters of fragrant white flowers appear, attracting birds and honey bees to the area.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 12-18 x 10-12m Form: Oval</p>

Corymbia citriodora 'Scentuous' (Dwarf Lemon Scented Gum)

Power line side



This tree is well known for the lemony scent that is emitted from its foliage year round, providing a beautiful aroma in any space. The Citriodora has a lush, dark green foliage and works wonderfully as a free-standing shade tree.

Mature Size (h x w): 7 x3m

Form: Oval

Option 3 – Single species (both sides of the road)

Lagerstroemia indica x *L. fauriei* 'Sioux' (Sioux Upright Crepe Myrtle)

Power line side and non-power line side



Creating quite the visual impact over a lengthy period, this variety offers masses of intense, pink flowers over summer, followed by stunning, rich foliage colour in tones of yellow, red and orange through autumn, before shedding its leaves. When mature, the bark of this variety will peel, creating a mottled effect to reveal the beautiful caramel-pink colour of its under bark.

Mature Size (h x w): 5 x 4m

Form: Round
