

Street Tree Renewal Information – Mimosa Street, Glen Waverley

The table below lists the details of the trees to be removed at each location. For replacement details please refer to map below.

No	Location	Species	Condition Assessment
1.	7 Mimosa Street	<i>Leptospermum petersonii</i>	Split between 2 limbs, failure will reduce canopy by approx. 1/3, < 2 Years ULE.
2.	914 High Street Road in Mimosa Street	<i>Tristaniopsis laurina</i>	Extensive damage to base, will not recover, < 2 Years ULE.
3.	8 Mimosa Street	<i>Tristaniopsis laurina</i>	Tree has developed on an angle, long term issues expected, < 2 Years ULE.
4.	24 Mimosa Street	<i>Callistemon linearis</i>	Splitting trunk, < 2 Years ULE.
5.	26 Mimosa Street	<i>Tristaniopsis laurina</i>	Lost leader branch and large wound in union leading to reduced vigour and poor form, < 2 Years ULE.

*< 2 Years ULE - with a useful life expectancy of less than two years

Proposed Species Options

Option 1 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

<i>Tristaniopsis laurina</i> 'Luscious' (Luscious Kanooka)	
Power line side and Non-Power line side	This native tree has a dense foliage canopy with glossy green leaves that are oblong shaped. Yellow flowers are borne in Summer and are abundant with nectar attracting birds. Smooth creamy trunk streaked with grey.
	Mature Size (h x w): 8 x 4m Form: Oval

Option 2 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

<i>Eucalyptus leucoxylon</i> 'Euky Dwarf' (Dwarf Yellow Gum)	
Power line side and Non-Power line side	This shapely dwarf Eucalypt has a light, open canopy with a single trunk and smooth bark that sheds. Its grey-green leaves once mature are offset by masses of nectar rich, pink, red and sometimes cream blossoms from late autumn to early summer, attracting native birds to the garden.
	Mature Size (h x w): 6-8 x 4-6m Form: Round

Option 3 – Single Species (both sides of the road)

<i>Cupaniopsis anacardioides</i> (Tuckeroo)	
<p>Power line side and Non-Power line side</p> 	<p>Medium sized native tree with a rounded habit and spreading crown. Dense green foliage flushes bright green in the warmer months. Yellow-green spring flowers are followed by ornamental berries containing showy orange seed pods.</p> <p>Mature Size (h x w): 8-10 x 6-8m Form: Round</p>
