GENERAL SUSTAINABILITY

- Book a free Staff or Student Monash Council education session.
- Book a Resource Smart School education session or audit.
- Join the Victorian Resource Smart School (RSS) program.
- Create sustainability posters (bin education, wildlife, save water, turn off lights).
- Educate school community on sustainable actions (newsletters, website, assembly presentations).
- Create a student, staff and/or parent Sustainability Team.
- Incorporate First Nations Perspectives for caring for country, native plants and water.
- Apply for grants (water, energy, waste).

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE




- Introduce or improve Council recycling/food waste bin.
- Nude food day/week/month.
- Introduce alternative recycling programs (Container Depost Scheme (CDS), e-waste).
- Reduce litter at school (regular pick up, Clean Up event, working bee).
- Introduce reuse stations (paper, stationery, books, uniforms).
- Upcycle, craft or mend using waste/litter.

BIODIVERSIT AND GARDENING



- Habitat garden planting and/or maintenance.
- Add or create habitat structure.
- Introduce or improve composting.
- Veggie patch planting and/or maintenance.
- Plant trees and/or bushfood species.
- Take part in local biodiversity activities (National Tree Day, Friends Of groups).


WATER
