4.4 TENDER FOR PAINTING AND GRAFFITI REMOVAL SERVICES (CF2020166: BM)

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Awards the tender from Kleenit Pty Ltd, Contract No. 2020161A for the category of Graffiti Removal Services for a fixed annual lump sum of \$24,979.40 and an estimated annual spend of \$70,840 (based on work load estimates) for programmed inspections and reactive works respectively, with an estimated total contract value of \$508,721 inclusive of all available extension options;
- 2. Awards the tender from Aesthetic Property Services Pty Ltd, Programmed Maintenance Service Pty Ltd and Quayclean Australia Pty Ltd for Contract No. 2020161B for the category of Painting Services for a schedule of rates based contract with the annual estimated contract value (based on anticipated program expenditure) of \$500,000 with an estimated total contract value of \$2,654,570 inclusive of all available extension options;
- 3. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to execute the contract agreements;
- 4. Notes that the contract will commence on 15 January 2021 with an initial term of one (1) year and the contract has two separate extension options of two (2) years each and authorises the Chief Executive Officer to approve extension options subject to satisfactory performance.

INTRODUCTION

Council has tendered for Painting and Graffiti Removal Services.

BACKGROUND

Monash City Council invited Tenders for the provision of Painting and Graffiti Removal Services with the option of offering the individual parts of Painting and Graffiti Removal either together or separately.

Council has over 380 buildings and various other structures and assets that require programmed and reactive painting and graffiti removal services. Contractors are sought to deliver Painting Services to Council's facilities and programmed graffiti inspection and reactive removal services.

Tender Conformance:

All submissions were assessed for their compliance with the tender conditions including the contractual terms and conditions and the requirements of the response schedules.

Eight (8) submissions were deemed non-conforming and these submissions were not evaluated further.

DISCUSSION

The following information supports the evaluation panel's recommendations.

For the category of Graffiti Removal, the panel considered that only one (1) supplier was necessary to deliver the service and a panel of three (3) suppliers was sufficient to enable appropriate painting services to be delivered.

The final evaluation (including price and non-price evaluation criteria) ranked the following four suppliers the highest.

- 1. Kleenit Pty Ltd Graffiti and Removal services
- 2. Programmed Maintenance Service Pty Ltd Painting services
- 3. Quayclean Australia Pty Ltd Painting services
- 4. Aesthetic Property Services Pty. Ltd. Painting services

Based on the total evaluations, interview and financial assessments, the evaluation panel recommends these suppliers as representing the best value outcome for Council.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

An independent financial assessment was conducted on the recommended tenderers and the assessment was satisfactory.

The total estimated value of both contracts over the maximum five (5) year term inclusive of all available extension options is \$3,163,291 (GST inclusive).

The current 2020/21 Operating Budget makes provision for an allocated budget as follows:

For the proposed Painting panel contract, future spend will be programmed in line with the approved budget.

Whilst the current Graffiti budget does not fully cover the proposed contract cost for the current financial year, the estimated \$10,000 shortfall will be accommodated from within the broader Facilities Management budget.

The future Graffiti budget will be adjusted to meet the requirements of this contract.

CONCLUSION

That Council approves the recommendations contained within this report.
