# ORC... opening in January!

The transformed Oakleigh Recreation Centre is officially opening in January 2021.

Following a \$25M upgrade, the fantastic facility includes five new indoor basketball courts with retractable seating for the number one show court, a larger gym with multiple rooms for fitness classes, new bathroom facilities and conversion of the previous basketball stadium

to a state level gymnastics facility for the Waverley Gymnastics Centre. Work on the upgrade began in May 2019 with Council planning to open in October 2020 but COVID-19 restrictions delayed work on the site. The redevelopment is one of the most ambitious projects ever undertaken by Council, with the challenges of the site requiring a complete reorientation of the existing building.

Council is pleased to be providing this important facility to the local community to meet the growing need for local and regional netball, basketball, volleyball, gymnastics and other sports.

The project builds on Council's commitment to a healthy and active Monash. Council has funded the project with contributions from State (through Sports Recreation Victoria) and Federal governments, and Waverley Gymnastics Centre.



# **MESSAGE FROM**Mayor Brian Little

I'm delighted and humbled to be elected your Mayor for the first year of our new Council term, and I thank my Councillor colleagues for their vote of confidence.

I really believe that this is the start of what will be a terrific term for Council. With the world opening up and COVID restrictions easing there is now a buzz around and a sense that everyone wants to make up for lost time.

A warm welcome to our new Councillors – Nicky Luo, Tina Samardzija and Anjalee de Silva - it is wonderful to have more women's voices in the chamber. With new faces comes new skills, new experiences and new perspectives.

The last 10 months have been the most challenging we have faced as a Council and a community. # Helping Monash recycle right

We understand recycling can be confusing at times and that our residents want to recycle correctly.

Following the great takeup of the food and green waste service, we want to understand what is still going in the general waste bin and if more education and information is needed.

Bin inspections will begin mid-December. If your bin has been inspected, we'll leave a tag on your bin and a note in your letterbox with feedback.

Using your bins correctly is important to help make sure your recycling can be sorted and turned into new products, and that food and garden waste can be composted for use on the farms that grow our food. The data will be aggregated and the selected households will not be identified.

# WORK TO START on child and family hub

Construction of the Wellington Child and Family hub is to start, delivering a state-of-the-art facility for the Mulgrave community.

The new facility is expected to be ready for the 2022 kindergarten year.

Council's Early Years Services Plan has identified Wellington Park kindergarten and the Mulgrave maternal and child healthproject as a priority for renewal and upgrade given the demographics of the local community, the identified needs of children and their families, the age of the building and the poor condition of both buildings. The integrated hub is the first of its kind in Monash.

At its November 2020 Council meeting, the tender for the facility was awarded to Alchemy Construct P/L. The State Government, through the Department of Education & Training, is contributing \$1M towards the \$3.3M project.

#### The scope of work includes:

- » Demolition of the existing kindergarten and maternal child health buildings
- A two room kindergarten with outdoor learning environment
- » A two room maternal and child health service
- A playgroup room and outdoor learning environment which can also be a multipurpose area
- » Additional car parking and landscaping.

#### **MONASH WINS**

### Sustainable City of the Year Award!

Monash is Keep Victoria Beautiful's (KVB) Overall 2020 Sustainable City of the Year.

KVB's Sustainable Cities Awards recognise and celebrate positive actions taken by communities in urban areas to protect and enhance their local environments.

Monash also won an award in the Environment (Council) category for the native bees and seeds kits that the Sustainable Monash team put together and hand delivered to 600 residents during the COVID-19 'stay at home' restrictions.

The kits were used by residents to build little bee homes in empty food cans, to attract Australian native bees to gardens and encourage pollination. Residents also grew indigenous plants from seeds to create a habitat garden while in lockdown.

The overall award recognises the commitment of Council and our local community groups in protecting and enhancing Monash's local environment:

- » The Clayton Zone Project - education about litter prevention and how to recycle and dispose of waste correctly for people living in Clayton was Highly Commended in the Litter (Council) category.
- » The War on E-waste free public event, held in August

2019 with ABC personality Craig Reucassel and a panel of experts, was Highly Commended in the Waste (Council) category. More than 800 people attended this event.

To win the overall Sustainable City award Council needed three strong projects from Council but also three strong entries from the community. The Waverley Garden Club, and Brentwood Secondary College were among those who entered supporting projects.

The Monash Youth Ambassadors (YABS) were also finalists in the Social Well-being category for their #MYAction2020 campaign.

# Other projects included in Council's submission:

- » Mackie RoadNeighbourhood HouseSustainability Hub
- » Corporate Gardens for Wildlife program at Dame Nellie Melba Retirement Village
- » Waverley Garden Club's City of Monash Open Gardens.

Monash joined the City of Bayside, City of Casey, City of Moonee Valley and City of Port Phillip - as a finalist in the overall Sustainable City Award.

# COMMUNITY GRANTS program to open

Each year Council provides funding to support community groups and organisations to deliver projects, activities and events to strengthen, enhance and benefit the Monash community through the Monash Community Grants Program.

In 2020/21 Council allocated funding in excess of \$2.4M across nine categories to many important and valuable community groups and organisations within the city and expects to do the same in 2021/22.

Applications for the 2021/22 round of the Monash Community Grants Program will open on Thursday 28 January 2021 and close on Thursday 4 March 2021. Local community groups and organisations are invited to submit applications for cash and in-kind funding to support activities taking

place between 1 July 2021 and 30 June 2022 within these categories:

- » Active Projects
- » Arts & Cultural Projects
- » Community Events
- » Community Strengthening
- » Community Strengthening Hall Only
- » Major Festivals
- » Neighbourhood Houses
- » Positive Ageing
- » Specialist Services.

Applicant Guidelines are now available online.

Council will be holding Applicant Information & Support Workshops throughout February 2021. These will provide a one-on-one opportunity to meet with a member of the Monash Community Grants team for advice on the program.

In addition to these sessions, Monash
Council will be holding two Effective Grant Writing
Workshops via Zoom on Monday
1 Feb and Thursday 4 Feb 2021.

All sessions are subject to current State Government advice and bookings are essential.

## SUBURBAN RAIL LOOP project update

The State Government has announced more detail on the next stage of the Suburban Rail Loop project and the three station locations in Monash.

The State Government has announced \$2.2 billion for initial and early works on Stage One of the project. Works will start in 2022.

This is a significant project with three stations in Monash at Clayton, Monash University and Glen Waverley, recognising the importance of Monash as a thriving and economically significant community and in particular the significance of the Monash National Employment and Innovation Cluster.

As part of the project, there

is opportunity to build on the strategic planning work already undertaken by Council in the Clayton and Glen Waverley activity centres, to further transform these centres, to improve the public spaces where people gather and to encourage investment in two of our major activity centres.

Council is seeking further information on government funding to assist in future planning processes and the provision of additional infrastructure that we anticipate will be required to meet the expected growth around the new Suburban Rail Loop stations.

Council is concerned how it is expected to fund the additional demand on its services.

Council is also keen to work with the government to minimise impact on local businesses during the construction phase and to ensure they are fully consulted and supported during the project.

Stage one of the project is Cheltenham to Box Hill taking in stations at Clayton, Monash University and Glen Waverley.

Council has three inter-related projects within the Glen Waverley Activity Centre that are likely to be impacted by the preferred station location and associated works including:

- » The detailed design for a mixed use multi-level car park at 31-39 Montclair Avenue
- » The Kingsway Streetscape Renewal works (the design for which was planned to commence following completion of the mixed use multi-level carpark)
- The marketing and sale of Council-owned properties at 14 Bogong Avenue and 155 Coleman Parade, Glen Waverley.

The Suburban Rail Loop is a State Government project.

# NETBALL COURTS

upgrade to start



The upgrade of the Waverley Women's Outdoor Netball Court is to start with Council awarding the tender for the work to Turf One Pty Ltd.

The State Government committed \$2M through Sport and Recreation Victoria (SRV) towards the improvement of the outdoor netball courts at Waverley Women's Sport Centre. The new courts will be compliant with Netball Victoria Facility Guidelines and cater for all levels of competition.

The project involves the redevelopment of eight acrylic hard courts and relocation of the existing playground.

The Waverley Netball Centre attracts approximately 8000 people per week to play, coach, umpire and spectate at the venue. The improvements to the courts reflect Council's commitment to providing greater opportunities for women's sport in Monash.

The design was developed to be sensitive to the surrounding landscape and infrastructure within Jells Park. As part of the design work, Council arborists undertook an assessment of the trees at the site and found that eight trees in the area were identified as having existing deterioration or issues compromising structural integrity and would require removal.

Council will plant an additional 25 advanced native trees and additional garden beds and shrubs as part of the project.

Materials from the site such as the existing asphalt surface and granular fill will be reused as reclaimed material.

# **REMINDER**

### swimming pool registration

Registrations of private swimming pools and spas were due by 1 November 2020.

Council will send a follow up letter this month to property owners who have not yet registered their pools and spas.

Council has a simple and easy online registration process through our website.

The new rules requiring registration were introduced in 2019 by the State Government to make swimming pools and spas safer and prevent young children from drowning.

All permanent pools and spas, and most relocatable ones capable of holding water to a depth greater than 30cm must be registered. These include: inflatable pools, above ground pools, indoor pools, hot tubs, bathing or wading pools.

Congratulations also to Enuki and Sneha for their Highly Commended entries in the Monash region.


