Adventure playspace ... COMING SOON

This month, works will begin to create the best playspace Monash has ever had.

Nestled within the bush surrounds of Valley Reserve (Mount Waverley), the playspace will provide naturebased play opportunities for people of all ages and abilities.

It will feature adventurous rope climbing courses; a tree house (a popular request from local children); and areas for outdoor classes including bush education.

More than 500 local residents (including the Friends of Scotchmans Creek and Valley Reserve) contributed their ideas and views to help create what will be Monash's first playspace of regional significance.

Responding to the community desire to protect the reserve's bush environment, the playspace will be primarily located on a lawn clearing

near the reserve's existing BBQ area. More BBQ and picnic areas (with shelter) will be created near the playspace, and additional trees and shrubs will be planted in the surrounds.

The playspace - which will cost about \$600,000 - is expected to be completed by late June 2015. It has the potential to be expanded, with plans devised for a second stage. Council





will consider funding the second stage as part of its 2015/2016 budget.

Works to remove 20 significant trees in Glen Waverley will begin this month, after the trees were found to be showing signs of major decline.

These are the first of 214 Monterey Cypress trees to be removed from the Avendon Estate over the next 10 years.

The 60-year-old trees will be replaced with a mix of local indigenous trees, shrubs and groundcovers.

Council investigated the health of the trees after residents in adjoining properties raised concerns about tree branches potentially falling and about tree roots spreading into their properties. Council engaged independent arboricultural experts to assess the condition

of the trees. The experts found that the trees were showing signs of significant decline.

The tree removal works will take about four weeks. During the works, there will be some temporary traffic diversions and street closures in the area.

Deadline for pet registrations

Dog and cat owners are reminded the annual deadline for registering their pet with Council - or for renewing their registration - is Friday 10 April.

All dogs and cats aged three months or older must be registered and microchipped. Registration costs \$45 for most dogs and cats that are desexed, with discounts for pet owners who are pensioners.

The fee amount hasn't been increased this year. The fees were increased substantially last year and several residents contacted Council to voice their displeasure. In response, Council froze the fees at their 2014 level, which means that most pet owners will pay the same amount this year as last year, without any increases for inflation.

Message from Mayor Paul Klisaris

As Mayor, I am fortunate to oversee improvements to the local physical environment while also working on social issues.

We are making great progress in implementing our \$27 million annual capital works program, resulting in upgrades to roads, parks and other community infrastructure.

In early April, we will open the first Council-funded synthetic sporting pitch in Monash, at Jack Edwards Reserve (Oakleigh). As it will be more durable than natural turf, the synthetic pitch will increase the amount of playing time available to members of the Chisholm United Football Club (with whom I am pictured). Other sports clubs and schools will also be able to book the facility.

We have started developing a draft Council budget for the 2015/2016 financial year, which we will put out for community feedback in May. Last year, Council increased its capital works budget by \$2.8 million, recognising there was a need to spend more on basic community assets such as drains, bike paths and parks.

This year, we're also having to start thinking about the State Government's rate capping policy, which they are planning to bring in for the 2016/2017 financial year. Rate capping is where any increases in rates are capped at the level of inflation or a similar measure. Monash - like other Victorian councils - is worried about the impact that rate capping could have on our ability

to maintain community assets. At Monash, we pride ourselves on keeping our rates as low as possible. We've worked hard to ensure Monash has the lowest rates of all 79 Victorian councils. We will continue to keep our rates low but we need the flexibility to be able to increase our rates above inflation if required and justified.

There are many social issues that continue to concern me: none more so than violence against women. I have invited the 2015 Australian of the Year Rosie Batty to be the keynote speaker at a local forum later this year on prevention of violence against women. Rosie is an outstanding, courageous role model for us all and I hope she is able to accept my invitation. Council has also pledged to make a submission to the Victorian Royal Commission into Family Violence, once submissions are sought.

I am also worried about the loneliness that many people out in our community feel. That's what is so great about events like the Chinese New Year and Lantern Festival (pictured), which brought thousands of people to Kingsway in a spirit of celebration at the start of this month. Thank you to the Monash Chinese Events Organising Committee for putting on a great day, with Council's support.

In a similar vein, I'm planning to hold a free event at Eaton Mall in Oakleigh





this Greek Orthodox Easter (Sunday 12 April). People will be able to come together, celebrate this special time, eat delicious food, and make new friends.

Council votes 'no' to land sale

After listening to strong objections from Oakleigh residents, Council has voted against a land sale in the suburb.

Council had been proposing to sell a piece of land - at the corner of Hanover St and Atherton Rd - to a developer for \$5.05 million.

The land currently provides public car parking and is where the Oakleigh Rotary Sunday Market is held. Many local residents and the Rotary market organisers were opposed to a sale, with Council receiving a petition with 3000-plus signatures.

At its February meeting, Council voted against the sale, demonstrating that Council places high importance on community views.

It is important to clarify that Council never intended that the Rotary market be closed down. If the sale had proceeded, Council would have ensured that an alternative location in Oakleigh was identified for the market. Having said that, it is understandable that there were concerns that a land sale could have disrupted the market.

Caring for our environment

We'd like community members to help us develop a new environmental sustainability strategy for Monash.

This will involve a review of the Monash Environmental Sustainability Road Map, which Council adopted in 2011. One of the objectives of the Road Map was to reduce Council's greenhouse gas emissions by 20% by 2020 (compared to 2010 levels). This target is expected to be close to being achieved when Council installs energy efficient light globes in 8,200 street lights this year.

We'd like to know what local residents and businesses think are important areas of sustainability that Council should focus on into the future. Come along to some FREE information sessions to tell us what you think the priorities should be.

You will also be able to find out more about the actions Council has taken to make Monash more sustainable including: introducing rainwater harvesting for irrigation and use in community buildings; installing solar panels and hot water systems on Council buildings; and biodiversity plantings.



To make it easier, Council has installed dog poo bag dispensers in several parks including: Hinkler Reserve (Glen Waverley), Homesglen Reserve (Ashwood), Federal Reserve (Mount Waverley), Lum Reserve (Wheelers Hill), and Southern Reserve (Mulgrave), with more locations to come. Protecting our 'garden city'

In late April, Council is expected to begin consulting with the community on the first stage of proposed changes to Monash's residential zones.

The proposed changes, flowing from the Monash Housing Strategy, aim to protect Monash's 'garden city' character. This is in response to concerns raised by residents about potential overdevelopment and the loss of neighbourhood character and vegetation.

Under the changes, more of Monash would be zoned Neighbourhood Residential (NRZ), a zoning which limits opportunities for increased residential development. Currently, heritage precincts in Oakleigh and Hughesdale are the only parts of Monash that are zoned NRZ.

Council is proposing to introduce the NRZ zoning across the Dandenong Creek Escarpment (taking in the majority of Wheelers Hill plus parts of Glen Waverley and Mulgrave). It is also proposed that properties abutting or interfacing with the Gardiners, Damper and Scotchmans creeks (in Burwood, Ashwood and Mount Waverley) be rezoned Neighbourhood Residential.

Stronger guidelines are also being proposed in areas zoned General Residential (which covers the majority of Monash). For example, Council is proposing guidelines to increase the rear and side setbacks of new buildings, and to require canopy trees, on sites undergoing redevelopment.

Council will consult widely before deciding whether to go ahead with the proposals. Affected residents and property owners will receive a letter explaining the proposed changes and how they can provide feedback. Public meetings will also be held across Monash.

Advocating for smoking ban

Council has asked the State Government to give priority to introducing a ban on smoking in outdoor eating areas.

When in Opposition, the Government committed to introducing a statewide ban on smoking in outdoor eating areas.

The Monash community is strongly in support of a ban, with 75% of surveyed residents saying they approve. Local parents often contact Council to express concern that their children are exposed to second hand smoke when their families eat out at local cafes.

Monash Mayor Paul Klisaris has recently written to Health Minister Jill Hennessy,

encouraging her to begin a consultation period with businesses soon, with a view to implementing a ban as soon as possible.

Victoria is far behind the rest of the country when it comes to introducing this ban. For example, smoking has been banned in outdoor eating areas in Queensland since 2006.

The current road map was developed back in 2011 to guide Monash's sustainable journey over four years.

As the road map expires this year, the committee is now working on developing a new ten-year environmental sustainability strategy. Preventing disease

Children can receive FREE vaccinations at local immunisation sessions run by Council's nurses.



FREE vaccinations are available for babies, toddlers, pre-school and school-aged children who have an Australian Medicare card (or are eligible for one).

The aim is to prevent diseases such as poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria and whooping cough. Eligible adults are also able to access some FREE vaccines. Bookings are required for evening sessions but not for morning sessions.

Tackling theft in sports grounds
